This can be used to access a variety of advice, such as: Strategy and Management, Finance Funding, HMRC/Tax, Legal Advice, HR & Recruitment, Sales and Marketing, Regulations, Premise Property Management, Innovation and Intellectual Property, Skills and Workforce Development. Your Digital Pathway - Santander

Community Grants

Plymouth Councillors will each have an annual grant allocation of £4,500 for 2021/22 to assist projects or not-for-profit groups/organisations in the city. This results in an overall fund of £256,500. Councillors may 'pool' their grants with other Councillors, in the same or different wards, to create a larger 'pot' should they wish. The maximum 'pot' within a ward of three members is therefore £13,500.

Plymouth City Council is supporting projects that help improve the city and make it a great place to live, work and play. Once an eligible project has raised 25% of their fundraising target from multiple pledges, if you meet the Council's criteria and sign up to their terms and conditions, Plymouth City Council may pledge 50% of the target (up to a maximum of £30,000). You need a crowdfunding project to apply for funding.

Construction Industry Scheme (CIS)

Under the Construction Industry Scheme (CIS), contractors deduct money from a subcontractor's payments and pass it to HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC). The deductions count as advance payments towards the subcontractor's tax and National Insurance.

Contractors must register for the scheme. Subcontractors do not have to register, but deductions are taken from their payments at a higher rate if they're not registered.

Food Safety & Hygiene

One of the most important elements about setting up a food business is food safety and hygiene. Plymouth City Council has a page dedicated to this, which includes booking onto food safety courses, which is a necessity for a food business owner or manager. There is also a section on advice for Food Outlets with regards to COVID-19.

Registration or Approval of Food Businesses

If your business handles, stores, processes or sells food you must register your business with your local authority at least 28 days prior to starting to trade. This includes restaurants, cafes, hotels, shops, canteens, market stalls, mobile catering vans, food delivery vans and businesses run from home. This applies to your business even if it falls outside of Plymouth boundaries, contact your local council or check the council website. Registration is free.

Food Premises Approval

Certain types of food premises are subject to product specific regulations. You will need to complete this form if your business manufactures meat, meat products including minced meat, fish or fishery products including shellfish, milk, dairy products and collagen. You must be approved by Plymouth City Council prior to your business opening.

Minimum Income Floor Guide

The Minimum Income Floor (MIF) allows the government to assume a certain level of self-employed profit, even if you don't earn that amount.

Unless you are in a grace period, if you are self-employed, are in the 'all work related requirements' group and your earned income is lower than your MIF amount, your MIF will be used instead of your actual earnings when calculating your Universal Credit (UC) award.
